

China solar power to battery in Nigeria



Overview

Targeting Nigeria's power deficit and resource development gaps, the Chinese energy firm plans to focus on building a new-generation power system alongside the development of a lithium battery industry chain. Chairman of Swiber Africa (Nigeria) Group, Dr Orji Uzor Kalu, and his GCL (China) Group counterpart, Zhu Gongshan, have signed a new energy industry framework cooperation deal in Dubai, United Arab Emirates (UAE), setting the stage for a wide-ranging partnership on power system development. China has tightened its grip on Nigeria's fast-growing solar market, accounting for more than 70 percent of all panel shipments into Africa's biggest economy in the first half of 2025. The latest data from the National Bureau of Statistics (NBS) showed Nigeria imported solar panels worth N242. 68. PowerChina, a state-owned global engineering and infrastructure conglomerate under China's State Council, has said it is partnering with the Rural Electrification Agency and other local partners to expand renewable energy access and deliver sustainable power solutions across Nigeria.
